Review (Lessons 1 -5)

Hey, Andrew! Teach Me Some Greek! Level 7 workbook begins with a review of Greek grammar that you have learned in the first three semesters of DIT Greek. Notice the instructions in each box that tell you what you should study before write your answers to the grammar questions.

We will not give you lessons telling you to review vocabulary. By now you should know that daily practice with your vocabulary flash cards is very important.
