“Teacher, we want that if we ask you, you may do for us.”

#### Purpose Statement

John 3:16

Οὕτως γὰρ ἠγάπησεν ὁ Θεὸς τὸν κόσμον, ὥστε τὸν Υἱὸν, τὸν μονογενῆ, ἔδωκεν, **ἵνα** πᾶς ὁ πιστεύων εἰς αὐτὸν **μὴ ἀπόληται**, ἀλλ’ **ἔχῃ** ζωὴν αἰώνιον.

Thus God loved the world, that He gave his only begotten Son, so that [ἵνα] everyone believing in Him may not perish, but can have eternal life.

#### Conditional Statement

**ἐὰν** γὰρ **ἀφῇτε** τοῖς ἀνθρώποις τὰ παραπτώματα αὐτῶν ἀφήσει καὶ ὑμῖν ὁ πατὴρ ὑμῶν ὁ οὐράνιος

For if [ἐὰν] you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you.

- when ("**When** you pray, do not be like the hypocrites...")
