Now, let me share that I have been reading some articles in old *Deaf Lutheran* newsletters recently. One newsletter was from the 5th Biennial 1979 ILDA convention in Memphis, TN. I do recall the one in Memphis very well because my husband, Rev. Mark Seeger, was very involved in working with the host committee during his vicarage year in 1977-78. I joined the committee to help planning with the committee members. As I was looking at

the convention pictures, I was in awe because I didn't realize how huge the crowd was—the rooms were so fully packed! The title of the convention was "Go and Tell!" (Matt. 28:19,20). The workshop topic was "Evangelism."

As I look back all of those past years of deaf churches and ILDA conventions with between 300-500 attendees. there were a lot more Deaf ministries in the US and Canada—say about at least 60 deaf churches, not including interpreted services. Now, in comparison to this past number of churches, the number of deaf churches has dwindled down to approximately only at the most 15 deaf churches. Needless to say, this is really devastating. So, therefore, we need to bring the Gospel to the unreached Deaf community with help from the Holy Spirit.

Let me end this article with Matt. 28:6: "He is not here, for He is risen, as He said, Come, see the place where He lay." Alleluia!

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ.

"Peace. Peace. Yet there is no peace," the prophet Jeremiah declares. Indeed,

in recent months it seems there is less and less peace in the world. Why? The Russia-Ukraine war is disrupting peace among the nations. Inflation is rising and filling us with anxiety. More and more people seem to think the answer to their problems is violence.

The future has become more uncertain for many people. It is the same as the prophet Nahum writes, "hearts melt and knees tremble." When our lives become disrupted and our future less certain, what do we do? Panic? Give-up? Whine? Doubt?

Consider Jesus' disciples on the first Easter Sunday. They were afraid and gathered together in a locked room. Their world was turned upside down and their future was filled with uncertainty and doubt. Jesus had been crucified, dead, and buried. Now the tomb is empty. In addition, the Jewish leaders are spreading lies that the disciples stole the body. We can certainly understand their fear and anxiety.

Yet, in their midst Jesus appears, alive! He declares, "Peace be with you." He comes to fulfill the promise He gave to them on the night before He died. "Peace I leave with you; My peace I give to you." Our risen Savior doesn't offer an earthly peace. Instead, Jesus offers peace with God. He accomplished this peace through His death on the cross and His glorious resurrection. He paid the price for our sins and satisfied God's anger.

Deaf Outreach Training and resources, Deaf Outreach in specific to your area, Deaf Culture to-day...A variety of resources you can use!




