Equipping Churches for Outreach

Deaf ministry is experiencing a momentous shift from the traditional stand-alone Deaf church to interpreted ministries at hearing churches. It is no longer fiscally viable for most Deaf churches to remain open without outside support. In addition, education has changed from all-deaf classrooms to mainstreamed classrooms with interpreters. The interpreted ministry model is more financially viable than a stand-alone Deaf congregation and may be a more comfortable setting for a Deaf person who grew up with interpreted classes.

As hearing churches begin to offer interpreted worship opportunities, they face unique cross-cultural challenges. Interpreted Ministry Support provides answers, resources, and networking with other churches to address those challenges and help congregations grow through them. Having the right tools can prepare a congregation, including hearing and Deaf members, for growth and outreach.
