2019 ILDA convention report

The 25th Biennial ILDA convention was held July 18-21, 2019, at the Capital Plaza Hotel in Topeka, KS, hosted by KansaSEED. The theme for the convention was "God Above Gold" Psalm 119:127.

Sara and David Hale and their committee did a wonderful job planning the convention and everyone seemed to enjoy themselves! For the first time there were service projects planned for Saturday afternoon. Fleece blankets were tied together for the homeless and mesh bags were prepared for the Harvesters Food Bank. Daily convention prayers and devotions were given by Rev. Paul Tessaro, Rev. Daryl Gehlbach, Rev. Mark Seeger, Rev. Tim Eckert and Rev. Edwin Bergstresser. The Saturday night banquet speaker was Rev. Bill Wrede, who gave a

very moving and powerful power point presentation of photos from his experience ministering and witnessing to

those people affected by falling of the Sept. 11 Twin Towers in New York City. His theme was "Remembering: Noticing the Past and Building a Future."

What Is Sin and Why Does it Matter? What is sin?

Whatever is contrary to the law of God as it

is revealed in the Bible (meaning against the 10 Commandments), not only what is done in thought, word and deed, but also whatever is in our nature that is contrary to the Law of God. Sin is not a human invention, nor does it change over time. The Law of God is eternal and will never change. The 10 Commandments are permanent and will always say the same thing. The Law of God is like the Law of Gravity, no matter how much you try to avoid it or change it, it still brings everything back to the earth. Therefore, throughout time what is good and evil has not changed. Sin is evil. (Genesis 3; Romans 3; 1 John 3)

Why does God's Law define what is good and sinful or evil?

In short, because God is God and we are not. Or rather, because God alone claims authority to decide what is good and what is evil and to command and forbid all of His creation accordingly. Just like a father and mother make rules for their children, so our heavenly Father makes rules for us (Exodus 20, Ezekiel 20).

What does God think about sin?

God hates sin and punishes sins in body and soul with temporal

and eternal punishments. (Psalm 5; Romans 2; Mark 9)

What kinds of sin are there?

There are two kinds: original and actual. Original sin is the sin received in our nature from Adam, who committed the first sin in the garden. Now all people are born with three things: 1. without righteousness; 2. a total corruption that desires evil; 3. with guilt that deserves everlasting punishment (Genesis 3, Psalm 51). Actual sin is what is done by the sinner in thought, word and deed against God's law (Mark 8). Original sin is corruption of the tree. Actual sin is the evil fruit that comes from the corrupt tree.

Why do we need to know this?

Jesus came to save sinners. The Holy Spirit uses the Law of God to convict you of your sin. Much like a man that does not realize what he looks like until someone holds up a mirror, so the Holy Spirit shows us our true reflection of sin in the law. Then, the Holy Spirit proclaims to you the comfort of the Gospel, that Jesus Christ died to take away your sin and give you everlasting life in its place. Christians actually rejoice in the Law, because it helps us see clearly the evil that weighs us down and the Gospel which shows us where to put our quilt and shame and evil deeds. Jesus died for your sin, so do not hide it, but confess it so that He can take it from you and in its place give you righteousness.
