

Lutheran Deaf Mission Society sponsors mission trip to Kenya

Pastor Tim Eckert traveled to Kisumu, Kenya, for a mission trip January 22-31, 2025. The Lutheran Deaf Mission Society (LDMS) is partnering with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Kenya (ELCK) to help them with Deaf ministry. LDMS is supporting a hearing pastor in Kisumu to gain the skills necessary to lead Deaf ministry for the whole church.

ILDA and other donors have supported Deaf children in Kenya by paying for their school fees. The same has happened in many places in Africa, there are many deaf children who are kept at home and never go to school. The parents don't understand the needs of a deaf child and often don't have the money to send them to school. (School, especially boarding school, is not free in Kenya). If the children don't go to school, they can't learn a language. If they don't know sign language, howcan you teach them about Jesus? One of the greatest needs in the rural areas of Kenya is teaching the communities bout the needs of the Deaf and helping deaf children go to school.

The ELCK has given LDMS a proposal to start a Lutheran school for the Deaf. That way more children can get a good education and especially learn about Jesus, their Savior. LDMS will be considering this proposal.

One of the most exciting things from this trip we working with Titus, a young Deaf man who graduated from school several years ago. He knows the Bible well, is smart, and wants to be pastor! We will be working with the church to train him and prepare him to become a Lutheran pastor for the Deaf in Kenya.

Some of the money ILDA has given for Kenya has been used to pay school fees. Some of the money was used to buy goats for the family. When the goats have babies ("kids"), the family can sell them and have money to help pay for school or things the children need in school. Titus wrote a thank-you for this support.

"I want to thank you for the goat project that you gave me and also the conference that I attended (in) Kisumu. The goat is going well and has 3 children, which one is pregnant. And I wanted to tell you that in the future I wish to be a pastor and may you help me to do that? Thank you for reading this."

Thank God for this blessing and thank you to ILDA for your support of this work!
